Vietnam escalates dramatically; Nationwide U.S. protests as U.S. troops invade Cambodia, some universities closed; 4 students killed at Kent State by National Guard; Univ. of Wisconsin students-- protesting war research-- blow up laboratory, destroy 1.5 million dollar computer; Lt. Calley court-martialed for My Lai massacre; 1st Earth Day in U.S.; Sex Education becomes issue in schools; U.S., USSR, UK, 45 other countries sign nuclear non-proliferation treaty; Pres. Nixon calls for elimination of all Federal water and air pollution, authorizes \$360 million; Congress passes Water Quality Improvement Act, Air Quality Control Act, creates Environmental Protection Agency; Computer related employment rises to 1 million; Polyester fabric claims 41% of textile market to cotton's 40%; Airline hijackings become more frequent; Supreme Court upholds 18 yr. old voting age; Cyclone in E.
